The El Dorado Irrigation District (District or EID) presents this Recreation Survey Monitoring Plan (Plan) to identify the strategies and methods for successful compliance with U.S. Forest Service (FS) 4(e) Condition No. 47 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission license for the El Dorado Hydroelectric Project No. 184 (Project 184).

1.0 License Requirements

This Plan is submitted in compliance with the El Dorado Hydroelectric Project FERC License Condition No. 47, which states:

Condition No. 47 - Recreation Survey

The licensee shall conduct a Recreational Survey and prepare a Report on Recreational Resources that is approved by the FS every 6 years from the date of license issuance. The Recreational Survey shall include, but not be limited to, changes in kinds of use and use patterns, levels of use, user survey as to preferences in recreation activities, kinds and sizes of recreation vehicles, preference for day use versus overnight use, carrying capacity information sufficient to indicate changes in capacity, and recreation user trends within the Project area. The Report on Recreational Resources shall comply with FERC's regulations at 18 CFR section 4.51(f) (1996), or as amended, and shall be provided to FS for review and comment prior to being filed with FERC. Within 1 year of submission of the Report on Recreation Resources, the FS, ERC, and other interested parties will meet to discuss the results of the Report and make recommendations to address the findings. In accordance with Condition No. 4, the FS reserves the authority to require changes in the Project and its operation to accomplish protection and utilization of National Forest resources identified as a result of these surveys.

The licensee will not be required to construct additional recreational improvements as the remedy for a FS determination that carrying capacity is being exceeded anywhere in the Project area. The licensee may be required to address resource impacts from Project-related recreation.

Per Condition No. 47, the District would utilize the recreation survey data to prepare a Report on Recreation Resources that complies with FERC Regulations 18 CFR section 4.51 (f)(5) (1996), as amended, which states:

(5) Report on recreational resources. The report must discuss existing and proposed recreational facilities and opportunities at the project. The report must be prepared in consultation with local, state, and regional recreation agencies and planning commissions, the National Park Service, and any other state or Federal agency with managerial authority over any part of the project lands. Consultation must be documented by appending to the report a letter from each agency consulted indicating the nature, extent, and results of the consultation. The report must contain:

- (i) A description of any existing recreational facilities at the project, indicating whether the facilities are available for public use;
- (ii) An estimate of existing and potential recreational use of the project area, in daytime and overnight visits;
- (iii) A description of any measures or facilities recommended by the agencies consulted for the purpose of creating, preserving, or enhancing recreational opportunities at the project and in its vicinity (including opportunities for the handicapped), and for the purpose of ensuring the safety of the public in its use of project lands and waters;
- (iv) A statement of the existing measures or facilities to be continued or maintained and the new measures or facilities proposed by the applicant for the purpose of creating, preserving, or enhancing recreational opportunities at the project and in its vicinity, and for the purpose of ensuring the safety of the public in its use of project lands and waters, including an explanation of why the applicant has rejected any measures or facilities recommended by an agency and described under paragraph (f)(5)(iii) of this section; and
- (v) The following materials and information regarding the measures and facilities identified under paragraphs (f)(5) (i) and (iv) of this section:
- (A) Identification of the entities responsible for implementing, constructing, operating, or maintaining any existing or proposed measures or facilities;
- **(B)** A schedule showing the intervals following issuance of a license at which implementation of the measures or construction of the facilities would be commenced and completed;
- (C) An estimate of the costs of construction, operation, and maintenance of any proposed facilities, including a statement of the sources and extent of financing;
- **(D)** A map or drawing that conforms to the size, scale, and legibility requirements of § 4.39 showing by the use of shading, cross-hatching, or other symbols the identity and location of any facilities, and indicating whether each facility is existing or proposed (the maps or drawings in this exhibit may be consolidated); and
- (vi) A description of any areas within or in the vicinity of the proposed project boundary that are included in, or have been designated for study for inclusion in, the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System, or that have been designated as wilderness area, recommended for such designation, or designated as a wilderness study area under the Wilderness Act.

2.0 Purpose of the Recreation Survey

The purpose of ongoing recreation surveys is to measure changes in user preferences, use patterns, recreational equipment design and quantity and quality of services provided in order to maintain an appropriate level of public use and satisfaction over the life of the license. The results of the survey will help the FS and EID prioritize necessary maintenance, rehabilitation, construction, and reconstruction work that is identified as part of FS 4(e) Condition 49 – Review of Recreation Developments.

3.0 Recreation Facilities Associated with Project No. 184

Recreation facilities associated with Project No. 184 that are incorporated into conditions of the FERC license include the following FS owned developments:

- Silver Lake East Campground
- Martin Meadow Overflow Camping Area
- Caples Lake Campground
- Caples Lake Auxiliary Dam Parking Area
- Caples Lake Boat Launching Facility
- Woods Creek Fishing Access
- Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail Crossing
- Echo Lakes Trailhead and Upper Parking Facility

Recreation facilities associated with Project No. 184 that are incorporated into conditions of the FERC license include the following EID owned developments:

- Silver Lake West Campground
- Ferguson Point
- Sandy Cove Day-use Area
- Silver Lake Boat Launching Facility

Figure 1 presents a map showing the locations of recreation facilities associated with Project 184.

4.0 Survey Methods

This section describes the specific methods and data sources that will be collected during the recreation survey. The survey will be structured such that measureable criteria and quantifiable data can be used to track changes in recreation use and trends throughout the term of the Project No. 184 FERC license.

This Plan focuses on collecting information regarding the quantity and quality of recreation experiences to evaluate recreation use and trends at recreation facilities associated with Project No. 184:

Quantity:

- Number of people recreating at each developed site
- Number of people recreating in general forest areas within the license boundary
- Locations where dispersed recreation occurs
- Number of people engaged in various activities
- Number of types and sizes of recreational equipment
- Number of day use vs. Overnight users
- Number of turn-away days at each developed site

Quality:

- User satisfaction of facilities (including availability and condition of accessible amenities)
- Perception of personal safety
- Feelings of being over-crowded
- Opportunities and demand for recreation experiences not currently provided

Calculating Recreation Use

Recreation use is separated into two separate categories; developed and dispersed. Developed use is that which occurs within the boundary of a built facility. Dispersed use occurs in the general forest area.

Developed recreation use is relatively easy to count. Counts can be done on a regular basis. The measure is finite i.e. campsites, picnic sites or parking spaces occupied. The use is associated with a specific campground, picnic area, boatramp, trailhead or parking area. User surveys can be accomplished at the location of the recreation experience. Obtaining survey data from developed sites is relatively easy due to the limited movement of the users.

Dispersed recreation use occurs in areas away from developed sites i.e. trail, shoreline, surface of lakes or general forest area. Concentrated Use Areas (CUA's) are finite spaces, usually at accessible locations near water or special places, which draw large numbers of people to recreate where no built facilities exist. To capture information from dispersed recreation users, data has to be collected at CUA's or recreationist's point of dispersion. Most dispersion occurs from a developed parking facility or wide spots along roads which can accommodate several vehicles. It is common to use factors to estimate dispersed recreation use. Based on agency familiarity of day use sites (number of people/vehicle, turnover, hours/activity) recreation use can be extrapolated.

Existing Data Collection Sources

The ENF requires the hosts at Silver Lake East C.G. and Caples Lake C.G. to collect use data under the concessionaire permit. This information includes daily counts of number of sites occupied, number of total people and total number of sites by equipment type (tent, trailer RV).

The ENF collects use data under the Desolation Wilderness permit system for both overnight and day use. Data is collected for destination zones accessed by two trailheads included under the

FERC 184 license, Echo Summit and Pyramid Creek. The overnight permit data includes the date, permits sold, number of people/permit and 1st night's camping destination. The day use information includes date, number of permits, people/permit and planned destination.

EID collects occupancy use data for Silver Lake West C.G. which includes daily counts of the number of sites occupied and equipment types (e.g., tents, trailer).

EID collects vehicle counts from revenue receipts at Caples Lake Boatramp. The use counts are divided into two categories; parking spaces used by vehicle/boat trailers and single vehicles attributed to day users. Boating recreationists are assumed to spend the majority of their time on the surface of the lake or shoreline physically separated from the boatramp. Day users are assumed to recreate physically at or adjacent to the boatramp.

EID collects vehicle counts from revenue receipts at Silver Lake. Vehicles are counted at the boatramp, at designated parking spaces along Kays Rd., and at the Silver Lake Dam. The parking areas are not associated with a developed site. EID collects vehicle counts from revenue receipts at Sandy Cove picnic area, which is considered a developed site.

Sampling Protocol

The following tables, calendar and voluntary questionnaires provide the specific details regarding data collection efforts for this Plan. This survey effort is intended to provide sufficient data to make well-informed decisions regarding potential changes to the recreation program for the six year period following the completion of the Report on Recreational Resources.

For all other recreation facilities associated with Project No. 184, in-person interviews will be conducted at the locations and intervals provided in the 2017 calendar (Attachment B). AM hours denoted on the calendars are intended to fall generally between 9:00 – noon. PM hours denoted on the calendars are intended to fall generally between 1:00 – 5:00 p.m. Every party encountered shall be asked if they are willing to take a 10 minute interview. The interviewer will fill out the voluntary questionnaire (Attachment A) for each party willing to be interviewed. The total number of parties that are asked to respond to the voluntary survey at each site will be recorded for each survey day.
